- The participants are requested to bring their songs in pen drive in .mp3 format with backup ready and should be submitted priorly to the coordinator before the start of the event. The file should be named as per the given format (Classical – Slot number- Institute name).
- Usage of props is allowed on stage during the performance. The participating team is responsible for removal of their sets / properties etc., immediately after the completion of their performance.
- The participants can sing/ use live music or instruments for the performance.
- Fusion between classical and western dance forms is highly discouraged.
- Judgement is based on the qualities like technique (15%), rhythm (10%), abhinaya or expression (10%), costumes (10%), footwork (10%), synchronization (20%) and overall expression (25%).

FOLK/TRIBAL GROUP DANCE

Participation: 1 group/institute

Team size: 5-15 members
Time limit: 6 +2 minutes
Rules and regulations:

- The dance can be either a primitive or a folk dance (Indian Style) but not a classical form.
- Folk or tribal forms like yakshagana, dollukunitha, kamsale, suggikunitha, huttarikunitha, garba, bhiu, raasleela, chhau dance, ghoomar, lavani, dandiya, thang ta, naga dance, gaur dance and bhangra are allowed to perform.
- Filmy folk songs are not allowed to perform, only authentic folk forms are allowed to perform. Negative markings will be given if deviated.
- Two copies of a brief note in English giving the theme and the text of song if any is to be submitted along with the pen drive.
- The participants are requested to bring their songs in pen drive in .mp3 format with backup ready and should be submitted priorly to the coordinator of the event. The file should be named as per the given format (Folk- Slot number- Institute name).
- Fusion between classical, folk and western dance forms is highly discouraged.
- The participants can sing/ use live music or instruments for the performance.
- Usage of props is allowed on stage during the performance. The participating team is responsible for removal of their sets / properties etc., immediately after the completion of their performance.
- Judgement is based on the basis of rhythm (15%), formation (10%), expression (15%), costumes (15%), make-up (15%), sets and overall performance (30%)
- Karaoke is allowed.
- The same member singing and playing an instrument is allowed, a 3rd person is not permitted.

- Judges decisions are final and binding.
- In the final round, teams will be scored (not individual members).
- The participants will be judged on the basis of Coordination among team members (35%), Individual proficiency in the piece, with equal consideration for both performers in a team (35%), Level of difficulty of the composition and overall performance (30%).

WESTERN SOLO DANCE

Participation: 2 members / institute

Number of Rounds: 2 Rules and regulation:

FOLK SOLO SONG

Participants: Maximum of 2 groups per institution

Team Size: Minimum of 4 members per group

Time Limit: 5 minutes for performance + 1 minute for sound check

Rules and Regulations:

• Teams may choose to perform with a karaoke track or use any of the following provided instruments: acoustic guitar, drum kit, synthesizer, and tabla.

- Additional instruments brought by the team are permitted; however, only a maximum of three instruments may be played simultaneously during the performance.
- Exceeding the time limit may result in point deductions.
- A team member may perform both as a vocalist and an instrumentalist, meaning they may sing and play an instrument simultaneously.
- Only Indian languages are allowed; songs or lyrics in English are strictly prohibited.
- Teams may perform a single song, multiple songs in different Indian languages, or a mashup of songs, as long as they remain within the time limit.
- Props and accessories that enhance the performance are allowed, provided they are relevant to the song and do not distract from the performance.
- All decisions made by the judges are final and are not open to debate or appeal.
- The Judging Criteria is as follows: Vocals (30%), Harmony (30%), Stage Presence (20%), Overall Impact (20%)

Number of rounds: Two
Rules and Regulations:

- Additional performers (such as a third person) are not permitted.

- The newly formed pairs will be given one day to collaborate and prepare their performance.
- Each team will have a time limit of 4 + 1 minutes, which includes time for sound-check and setup.
- Teams must perform a song of their choice, showcasing their combined musical skills and creativity.

- Teams will be scored as a unit, rather than individual members.
- Judgement: Team Coordination (30%), Individual Proficiency (30%), Composition Difficulty and Overall Performance (30%), Stage Presence and Audience Response (10%)

Rules and regulation:

- A college is permitted to have a maximum of two teams, with each team comprising minimum of 12 members and a maximum of 20 members. The team composition must include choreographers, designers, models, and makeup artists, all of whom contribute to the specified member limit.
- Round Structure: The competition only consists of one round, with a time allocation of 2 minutes for pre-performance preparations, a 12-minute performance duration, and 2 minutes for postperformance activities.
- All teams have the freedom to choose any theme for their performance (open theme).
- Professional choreography, design, or make-up is strictly prohibited. If such assistance is reported to the coordinators, the team will face disqualification from the event.
- Teams exceeding the specified time limits will incur penalties. For surpassing the time limit, the penalties are as followed: 3% deduction per minute. If a team exceeds the time limit by more than 5 minutes, they may be asked to leave the stage, facing an additional penalty of 4%.
- Teams are accountable for their costumes, makeup, and background music. It is recommended that teams bring their soundtracks on easily transferable media like USB drives.
 Additionally, teams should keep a backup copy of the soundtrack in their email in case of technical issues. Teams must send their music tracks 10 days before the festival to prevent inconvenience.
- Teams are advised to communicate specific lighting and smoke requirements (if any) well in advance through documented formats such as email, as professional lighting will be available. Keeping a printed copy of these requests is also suggested to avoid lastminute complications.

- The presence of water, fire, and animals in any form is strictly prohibited on both the stage and ramp. The ultimate decision on prop usage lies entirely with the event coordinators. Teams must bring their props for performances, and no requests for provided props will be entertained
- Teams are encouraged to prioritize sensuousness over obscenity in their presentations. The consequences of obscenity may impact the scoring, so teams are advised to consult coordinators if they are uncertain about the appropriateness of their sequence.
- Practice slots will be allocated to all teams to refine their timings and performances.
- All teams are required to arrive at least 90 minutes before the event begins.
- Each participating team must submit digital copies of postcardsized photographs of all models, with numbers indicating their order of appearance on the runway. Additionally, teams are required to provide a list of models with corresponding numbers before the festival.
- Only participants previously mentioned allowed entry; requests for entry of other individuals, including college mates, will not be entertained.
- Details regarding themes will be shared later on the website, Official Facebook page, and Instagram page.
- JUDGEMENT CRITERIA: Originality (10%), Makeup and Styling (20%), Utilization of Props (10%), Choreography and Ramp Walk (30%), Costume Design (20%), Overall Impact on the Audience (10%)


Rules and regulations:
